HEADQUARTERS HIGHLIGHTS

THERE are recordings of two of the meetings of the First International Conference in Cleveland, 1950, on sale at your General Service Office. The Big Meeting (four sides of two Long Playing Records) Dr. Bob and Bill speaking, sells for \$8.50. The Traditions Meeting (four sides of two L.P. records) with Bill and six other speakers, sells for \$7.00. Both meetings ordered together are \$15.00.

Dr. Bob's last major talk, recorded by a member in Detroit a

few years ago, is also available now at \$5.00 (two sides of one L.P. Record.) There are a few sets left of two recordings made by Bill some time ago; A Talk by Bill, 1947, sells for \$3.30 (two records, 78 rpm); Milestones of AA, a single record (78 rpm) sells for \$2.25.

Orders for all recordings must be accompanied by check, cash or money order. Parcel post mailing is included in the quoted prices. For railway express add 50¢; for air express add \$1.00 extra.
