New York City Sets Up "Clearing House"

The A.A. Cosmopolitan Club of New York has begun two new "clearing house" services for the metropolitan area. The club distributes a folder listing 46 meetings held weekly in Long Island, Connecticut, and New York City; and the secretarial staff notifies each regional group when a new member from its locality contacts the Club.

Twenty-six groups in the area meet at 30 separate addresses in such diverse quarters as medical buildings, a museum, fire department headquarters, a woman's club, a Girl Scout hall, civic and political clubs, hotels, churches, YMCA's and YWCA's. More than half the meetings are open to non-alcoholics.
